There are many options available for our Medicare clients including Medicare Advantage plans, Medigap coverage and Medicare Part D. We want to make sure that we answer all of your questions and concerns to make sure that you are comfortable with the choices you make about your Medicare benefits.

Open enrollment for Medicare began on October 15th and we are here to help you with any changes and/or additions you want to make.

Columbia River PUD has assistance programs available to assist low-income customers with their utility bills. If you have a need for assistance, please call Customer Accounts at (503) 397-0590.

The GLOW Fund The Neighbor's GLOW (Give Light, Offer Warmth) Fund provides emergency bill payment assistance to low-income PUD customers who are facing disconnection of their electric service for non-payment. GLOW Funds are available for customers once each calendar year and customers may apply at any time. For more information call Customer Accounts at (503) 397-0590.

The Special Waiver The Special Waiver Program waives the \$8 monthly customer charge for families living on low or fixed incomes. We waive the charge for customers who meet the low-income requirements from the State of Oregon. Call Customer Accounts (503) 397-0590 if you think you may qualify. If your only source of income is Social Security, or if your income is above the guidelines above but you have significant medical expenses, you may still qualify for the Special Waiver.

The LIHEAP Program The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) is a federally-funded program that helps low-income households with home heating costs. Community Action Team distributes LIHEAP funds in our area. For more information about LIHEAP, contact Community Action Team at (503) 397-4951.
