Want to avoid spending a day in the dark? It's as simple as 8-1-1. Are you planning a yard or patio project? Planting a tree? Installing a fence? Replacing your mailbox? Installing a pond or fountain? Please WAIT! There's an important – and free - phone call that you should make first. 8-1-1 is the phone number to dial before you dig anywhere on public or private property.

Call 8-1-1 a few days prior to digging and your call will be routed to your local One Call Center. Tell the operator where you're planning to dig and a locator will be sent to mark the locations of buried lines, pipes and cables so you'll know what's below – and be able to dig safely.

Remember; always call 8-1-1 before you start any digging project! You'll avoid injury, expense and a day in the dark.
