Prepare for Outages and Emergencies – Tips from Columbia River People's Utility District

Are you prepared for a winter weather emergency? As the old saying goes, an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure. Whether you are faced with a storm, a natural disaster or an extended power outage, a home emergency kit will keep you safer and more comfortable. The following basic supplies will help you be prepared for an unexpected loss of electricity.

- Flashlight & radio with fresh batteries
- Battery operated clock
- Lantern or candles & matches
- One gallon of water per person per day
- Blankets, sleeping bags & warm clothes
- Nonperishable food items that require little or no cooking, such as instant soup, snack bars and canned fruit
- Camp stove for outdoor cooking
- First aid kit
- Supply of prescription medicines
- Playing cards, games & books to help pass the time

You should also keep a smaller kit in your car with water, food, warm blankets and spare clothes. For more information about creating a home emergency kit, visit <u>www.ready.gov</u>.




