Tips for Using Electricity Safely at Home

When it comes to staying healthy, simple acts of safety are just as important as a balanced diet and regular exercise. In honor of National Electrical Safety Month, here are a few electrical safety tips from Columbia River PUD to help keep you safe.




 Use outlets with ground fault circuit interrupters in bathrooms, garages, near kitchen sinks and outdoors. These devises can prevent shock.

• Keep electric cords and appliances away from water. Always unplug an appliance before cleaning. Even if turned off, it can shock.

- Never overload an outlet with multiple appliances.
- Use safety covers on all electrical outlets that are within the reach of young children.
- Never use appliances or electronics with damaged or frayed cords.
- Extension cords are for temporary use only. Avoid running extension cords through walkways to prevent tripping hazards.
- When working outdoors, look up and around to avoid contacting overhead power lines.
- Always call 8-1-1 before digging, for free locating of underground electric lines and other utilities.

Most injuries don't happen by chance or "accident." By reviewing these simple tips and staying alert, you can stay safe.





May Gardening Tips

May is generally the first month to put out vegeteble starts such as tomatoes and eggplants.

• If you haven't already, add some lime to the soil when planting fruiting vegetables.

• Begin to acclimate your plant starts to the outside temperatures.

• It's not too late for leaf greens and cole crops (cabbage, broccoli,, etc)

Trees, Flowers and Shrubs

• Roses are preparing for their first blooms, feed them well and look for invasive pests.

• Rhodedrons, azaleas and other flowering shrubs can be pruned just after the bloom. Mild to moderate pruning is recommended for next year's blossoms.

Indoor Plants

• Now's the time to feed the plants, clean the leaves and check/treat for pests.

• When the weather is good, set plants outside for some good air.
