Tips for Using Electricity Safely at Home

Electricity travels the path of least resistance. If you come in contact with electricity, it can pass through your body, causing serious injury or death. In honor of National Electrical Safety Month, here are a few electrical safety tips from Columbia River PUD to help keep you safe.

•Use outlets with ground fault circuit interrupters in bathrooms, garages, near kitchen sinks, and outdoors. These devices can prevent shock.

•Keep electric cords and appliances away from water.

•Do not touch electrical appliances or tools if you are wet or touching water. •Never overload an outlet with multiple appliances.

•Use safety covers on all electrical outlets within the reach of young children.

•Never use appliances or electronics with damaged or frayed cords.

•Extension cords are for temporary use only. Avoid running extension cords through walkways to prevent tripping hazards.

•Call the PUD at (503) 397-1844 before pruning or trimming trees near power lines.

Tree limbs, tools, or ladders touching power lines can electrocute you.

• Always call 8-1-1 before digging, for free locating of underground electric lines and other utilities.


May Special Events

The Easter Bunny came to help our seniors get into the spirit by handing out "goodies". All our seniors enjoyed the treats and idea of spring being on the way.






