### Hydropower is the perfect partner for renewables

The Columbia River acts like a giant battery backup for intermittent power generated by renewable energy sources like wind and solar. On a very windy day, for example, river operators can reduce hydropower output and store that water for later, when the wind isn't blowing or the sun isn't shining.

Hydropower is an ideal balancing resource because of its flexibility, meaning it can respond quickly to shifts in wind and solar output. Hydropower can easily be turned on and off.

This is an important quality that helps maintain the electric system's reliability. For the electric grid to operate, the amount of power produced must equal the amount of power being consumed every second of every day.

Solar power peaks during the day. Wind tends to peak at night. Meanwhile, the water cycle is constant, ensuring hydropower is available any time day or night to provide the foundation of energy in the Northwest. It helps fill the gaps left by variable energy sources like wind and solar.
