Help Celebrate 40 Years of Public Power!


You are invited to join Columbia River PUD for hot dogs and an open house on Thursday, August 29, from 1:30 to 3:30 p.m. to help celebrate 40 years of the PUD providing public power.

In addition to enjoying hot dogs, you'll be able to see bucket trucks up close and personal. There will be fun activities for the kids and giveaway items for all.

There will also be a slideshow displaying historic images of the PUD throughout the afternoon.

The PUD office will be closed from 11:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. that day for an employee luncheon.

The PUD began providing electric service to Columbia County residents on August 31, 1984. At the time, the Board pledged to keep rates 5% lower than the previous investor-owned utility's rates. Today, CRPUD rates are about 40% lower, which resulted in \$15.5 million in savings for CRPUD customers in 2023.



The total amount CRPUD customers have saved since 1984 is \$173 million.
