Presenter Brian Sacre from Access Technologies, Inc. demonstrated items from gardening tools; kitchen utensils; hearing and sight aides; items to help with arm & hand tremor; glasses to help with macular degeneration, even Artificial Intelligence stuffed animals for emotional support. Keep Your Heating Costs Down this Winter

- Lower the temperature on your thermostat a couple of degrees when you are away or asleep.
- Keep windows and doors closed to keep the heat from escaping. That includes doors to garages or unheated basements.
- Clean or replace your furnace filters on a regular basis and service your heating system annually.
- If you have zonal heat, only heat the rooms you use regularly.
- •If you have central heating, use a space heater in the room you occupy most and lower the temperature in the rest of your home by a few degrees.
