

Cooling Tips From CRPUD

You can save on your electric costs this summer by following these tips from the Energy Experts at Columbia River PUD:

1. Use fans instead of air conditioners. Fans increase air movement, which can make you feel up to five degrees cooler. They use less energy than air conditioners. Just remember to turn fans off when you leave a room because fans don't actually cool a room, they simply make you feel cooler.

2. Clean or replace your furnace filter regularly. This will help your air conditioner run more efficiently.

3. Cook more meals in your microwave or on an outdoor grill. This will heat your food without heating your home.

Or eat meals like salads and sandwiches that don't require cooking.

4. Set your thermostat to 78 degrees or higher to save energy.

5. Close windows, doors, and blinds on hot days. Open them when it cools down to let breezes through.




