

### Electric Rates Will Change on April 1

Electric rates for Columbia River PUD customers will change on April 1 due to anticipated cost increases from Bonneville Power Administration, the PUD's wholesale power provider.

For the average CRPUD residential customer, this means a roughly \$9 per month increase. That amount will vary customer to customer based on usage.

Residential customers will see a \$2.50 increase on their monthly base charge and a 0.6¢ per kilowatt hour increase on their energy charge.

As of April 1, the base charge will be \$25 per month and the energy charge will be 7.79¢ per kWh.



Customers who qualify for the PUD's Income-Qualified Senior Discount program receive a \$20 discount on their monthly base charge and a 10% discount on their energy charge. To see if you qualify, please call the PUD at (503) 397-1844.
