September is National Preparedness Month

September is National Preparedness Month, the perfect time to assemble an emergency kit and create a plan for you and your family in the event of a natural disaster or extended power outage.

Your emergency kit should have at least one gallon of water per person per day for at least three days. You should also have at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food per person. If you can, keeping a two-week supply is preferable.

Here are some other items you should include in your kit:

- Supply of prescription medicines
- Flashlight & radio with fresh batteries
- Battery operated clock
- Lantern or candles & matches
- Blankets, sleeping bags & warm clothes
- Camp stove for outdoor cooking
- First aid kit
- Playing cards, games, and books to help pass the time It's also important to create an emergency plan. This will help you determine:
- Your shelter plan
- Your evacuation route
- Your rallying point if your home is not accessible

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
